**Marriages:** Arrangements/instructions must be made with the pastor at least 6 months in advance. Parish membership of the bride and/or groom or their parents is required.


**Visitation of the Sick:** Please call the parish office if you or a member of your family would like a visit.

~ St. Mary-Hannah 16th Sunday Ordinary Time ~July 18, 2021 ~

From Fr. Joe

On this 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time (cycle B), we hear of the apostles (*whom, in last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus had sent out in pairs*) telling Jesus all that they had done and taught during their journeys. Jesus, realizing they were tired, instructs them to go to a deserted place and rest a while. That's good advice for all of us – to get away and relax and rest.

Some people take that advice to the extreme of taking a break (a “vacation”) from all their responsibilities – even of going to Mass. However, for many, if not most of us, what we really struggle with is actually finding a “**deserted place**” and the time to “**rest a while.**”

But a deserted place doesn't have to be somewhere that takes extensive travel plans or expense. It could be as simple as an unoccupied room or corner of your home or yard. And regarding time; that could simply be an interval away from technology, from your cell phone, tablet, computer, television. And it doesn't have to be for an extended period of time (*as nice as that would be*). In this busy world that we live in – sometimes by our own choice – it may be just finding 15 or 30 minutes to “get away and rest.”

May I make a suggestion? Don't wait until you *find* some time – set the time aside. Believe me, I understand it is easy for me to say that, but actually doing it is another matter. (*I know because that's something I struggle with myself.*) But think of it this way – do you set aside time to eat? To play golf? To go fishing? To paint your toenails? To ... (*whatever*)? We do when it's important enough to us. Jesus thought getting away to a deserted place to rest was important for his disciples. As with so many things regarding Jesus, we need to listen to him and follow his lead.

But what if you have a family with children, or elderly parents or siblings that you are responsible for and they need your attention – and seemingly ALL THE TIME – before you can even get to that deserted place? (*You know, like*

*the people in this Sunday's Gospel who were coming and going in great numbers that Jesus and the apostles didn't even have time to eat, or the people who ran ahead and arrived at the apostles' deserted place before them – see Mark 6:31-33*) When Jesus saw those vast crowds, who were like “**sheep without a shepherd**”, his heart was moved with pity for them, and he attended to them. In moments like this with our families, we simply may have to *momentarily* set aside ourselves and attend to them. However, that being said, Jesus would still carve out time away for himself to spend in prayer with his heavenly Father – because it was important. At times he got up early before the others (Mark 1:35), or stayed up late (Matthew 14:23; Luke 6:12).

Sometimes we struggle because we feel like everything depends on us – you and me. While we do have responsibilities that God gives us, we need to remind ourselves that ultimately everything depends on God. When we take/make/set aside the time to get away, whether on vacation – or even a 15 minute break – to relax, refresh, maybe read or pray, we give a visible and public witness that God is God and we are not.

And you know what else? That *effort*, and for some that *struggle*, it takes to set aside even a few moments to get away and rest, can be “offered-up” as a prayer for someone or something. Yes, that can be a prayer which not only benefits you (*by resting or/and praying*), but also someone else who needs some prayer. Would you be willing to try it even just for this next week? Will you join me in setting aside some time this week for yourself, and in the process pray for someone else? I'll tell you what, it might be for only a couple of 15 minute periods during this next week, but I will do that as a prayer for you.

Have a blessed week of going to a deserted place and resting – and letting God be God.
