### From Fr. Joe

This past week there was a lot of hype surrounding the solar eclipse (the partial eclipse, in our part of the country). It was a pretty neat experience, though admittedly, had I not known the eclipse was going to happen Monday afternoon, I probably would have thought that the diminished light was merely the result of clouds – except for the fact the sky was clear! I did get to see the partially obscured sun - using appropriately filtered eye protection of course - but if it hadn't been for those special lenses I wouldn't have. I happened to have been in Grand Rapids for this most recent eclipse. Seven years ago (in August 2017) there was another partial eclipse during which I was in a wooded rural setting at the time and found it interesting that, even though it wasn't "dark" outside, owls started hooting. So, this natural phenomenon of the sun being obscured by the moon was noticed, and not just by the scientifically minded, and a lot of attention was given to it.

On this 3rd Sunday of Easter the Church gives attention not to the sun being obscured by the moon, but to yet again another account of the "Son" appearing to his disciples after his resurrection. Why so many accounts? I don't mean to sound so glib about that wonderful news, but hey, come on, we get the idea - Jesus has risen, and he showed himself alive to those who had seen him die. But maybe that's the key! Sure, we've heard or read or seen a movie about Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection, however we didn't witness those things personally. (Remember in last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus saying to Thomas: "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." [John 20:29]) But what if you had personally seen someone be tortured, and die, and then buried - I mean you KNOW THEY ARE DEAD - and then you see them alive again? What would your reaction be? Would you be afraid, at least initially, or would you be overjoyed? Would you tire of hearing the story over and over again? (You might even be the one doing the *telling!*) In the Gospel we hear this Sunday, when the disciples were initially startled and terrified, Jesus said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts?" (Luke 24: 38) Though Jesus didn't state it this way, you can almost hear the implication, "Hey, why are you troubled? Don't worry. I've got this. Trust in me!"

Now please, please don't think I am trying to equate the passion and death that Jesus went through to those things in our lives that are tortuous and cause us to suffer. Sometimes it may seem or feel that our experiences are just as bad, or worse, because ... well ... they happen(ed) to us, to me.

I'm going to jump back to the partial eclipse – one of the things that amazed me about the eclipse, even when the sun was almost totally obscured, was how light it still was outside, and with enough light and power that if we didn't use those special glasses your eyes could be damaged. There are two ways to look at (pun intended) this phenomenon which are polar opposites.

I'll start with the view that has negative implications. If you let or allow evil into your life – even a little sliver – it can overshadow the goodness that is about you; obscure the love surrounding you; and bring out the things of darkness.

So, what's the other view?

No matter what's going on in your life, no matter how dark it might be or get, if you let or allow the light of Christ into your life – even a little sliver – it can overshadow the evil that is about you; let you know and experience the love surrounding you; and bring out the things of daylight – the light of truth.

The same phenomenon, two different outlooks. Look through the lens of faith and see "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him." (1 Corinthians 2:9).

Another comment regarding the eclipse, something I heard on EWTN Radio this week: "The moon may block the light of the sun, but it can't block the light of the Son." May the light of Christ always illumine you.

The Church in her wisdom requires her priests to make an annual 5 day retreat, and that is what I and many of the priests of our diocese will be doing this week. While on retreat, you will be in my prayers. Have a Blessed 3<sup>rd</sup> week of Easter.
